A Letter from your Pastor

Friends in the Lord,

Happy New Year to you! I pray you experienced inner peace and joy as you again celebrated the birth of our Savior. May the wonders of His love continue to enrich you as we begin this new year.

On various occasions I have made the statement that one of my goals here at St. Paul is to study every single book of the Bible with you. As of the end of December, I have been here as your pastor for 12 ½ years. How are we progressing? Out of the 66 books in the Bible, I have led studies on 55. Since there are 66 books in the Bible, at this pace, I will need to be here at least 2 ½ more years to cover every one of the Bible's books. We have covered 25 of the 27 books in the New Testament (93%),


but only 30 of the 39 books in the Old Testament (77%). This is fairly typical. The New Testament is more familiar to us and also more readily understood by us; however, without the Old Testament the New Testament would not make sense and ultimately would not exist. The events recorded in the New Testament are fulfillments of prophecies made in the Old Testament. The ministry of Jesus and His institution of a New Covenant was necessary because of what happened, and did not happen, under the Old Covenant.

Where is all of this leading? I guess what I'm saying is that even though we are beginning a new year, in this new year you can expect to hear a little more from the Old Testament as we remember the predictions of the Savior the

Father promised He would send.

May God bless us in this new year as we continue our travels down "Route 66," en route to eventually studying all 66 books of the Bible together.




New Wednesday Morning Bible Study on Isaiah

Our Wednesday morning Bible study led by Pastor Jenks will resume on January 6. We will begin a new Bible study of the book of Isaiah. Just as the Bible has 66 books, Isaiah has 66 chapters. Isaiah is the first of the Old Testament books in the section known as the Major Prophets. These books contain a great deal of material and many Messianic

prophecies. Isaiah's many prophecies cover Christ's life from His virgin birth to His suffering and death to His resurrection. Our Wednesday morning Bible studies start at 10:30 a.m. and usually conclude at about 11:30 a.m. To get the most from our first session, if you are able to do so, please read chapters 1-4 of Isaiah prior to coming. (If

you have extra time, read all 66 chapters of the book, to get an overall overview.)





A New Year for the Christian Steward

Although there is nothing in the Bible about New Year's resolutions. many good stewards take advantage of this time of year to become closer to the Lord. They may re-commit themselves to pray more, to read the Bible, or to attend church services more regularly. If you are looking for some help in your New Year's resolutions, here are a few ideas to get you started:

Encounter the Lord
each day – Find time
to be with the Lord
each day, whether it be
for an hour or ten
minutes. Have a conversation with the Lord.
Give your joys and worries to Him and allow
God's love to transform
them. Our encounters
will keep our eyes and
ears open to the presence of Christ in our
midst.

Practice gratitude -

Cultivating a grateful heart is the hallmark of a Christian steward. Every day, express thankfulness to the Lord and to others. Seeing the good in your life will allow you to keep your heart compassionate and loving.

Nurture friendships

- Our friends are those we choose to be with, those with whom we spend our evenings, with whom we vacation, to whom we go to for advice. Friends are gifts from God who give us a greater appreciation of God's love for us. Friends need our time and love.

Resist overwork -

There may be pressure in your work life to produce, meet goals, and be successful. But activities that lead us to overwork, constant fatigue and worry do not give glory to God. What God calls us to do we

can do well. Be mindful that life requires balance, down time and letting go of unrealistic goals.

Make a difference in your church community — Believe it or not, your church community can use your time & talents. Offering your time & talents to your faith community is one of the most effective ways to feel useful and connected to others, and it is a potentially life-changing New Year's resolution.

Turn to the Lord -
