
A Message from Pastor Jenks

Friends in Christ,

Maybe you have heard these words: "Where there is no vision, the people perish" (Proverbs 29:18). These words of Scripture are often quoted and likewise often misquoted. You see, the Bible isn't speaking about the kind of organizational strategic planning for which many utilize this verse. The Bible is talking about a vision from God and from His Word. God is telling us that without His vision, apart from His Word, we will perish. Thus, the lesson in application is not about some organizational picture of a company's ideal future, but rather about God's ways as the only way to thrive.

This verse is quite relevant to us as we begin the process of developing a 10-year vision for the Lord's mission and ministry at St. Paul. What

we are seeking to develop is not our plan, but God's plan. "Many are the plans in a man's heart, but it is the Lord's purpose that prevails" (Proverbs 19:21). What we are seeking is not our will, but God's will. "Father, not my will, but Thy will be done" (Luke 22:42). What we want to discover during our vision creation process is not our preferences on what St. Paul will look like 10 years from now, but the Lord's preferred future for what His church will look like 10 years from now here at St. Paul.



"Instead, you ought to say, 'If it is the Lord's will, we will live and do this or that" (James 4:15).

As we begin the vision development process for St. Paul this fall, your prayers are requested as we begin the steps to seek God's 10-year vision for our congregation. Your prayers are also requested each step of the way. Ask God to lead us and guide us. "I know, O Lord, that a man's life is not his own; it is not for man to direct His steps" (Jeremiah 10:23). "The Lord has determined our path" (Proverbs 20:24a).



Lion's Club: Eyeglasses. (Box is located on top of the coatrack).


Riverside Manor: Small trinkets/items for Bingo prizes. (Box located on shelf of WEST coatrack).




Fabrics Needed

Vision Steering Committee

The Vision Steering Committee has begun the process for the development of a 10-year plan for the future of our congregation. One of the beginning steps in developing a strategic plan for St. Paul's future is gaining information about the vicinity around our church. We have invited our neighbors to activities such as free garage sales and concerts, to come to our church, and to consider it as a future church home for them. But we really have not actually gone out into the vicinity around our church to gain an understanding of how our church can help the neighbors or meet their church needs.

To better understand the nature of the surrounding community and our neighbors we will ask our members to volunteer as teams to make a prayer walk into the area surrounding

our church. Each prayer walk team will write down what they see and the general character of the area. The Vision Steering Committee will use this information to lead the congregation in developing the draft of our 10-year plan for the future. Each prayer walk team will begin at the church with a prayer asking God to guide our walk and to give us insight as to the needs of our neighbors. We won't be knocking on doors, but will be open to talking to those outside their homes to tell them about St. Paul and ask them how our church could help them.



The prayers walks will begin in the fellowship hall during the education hour on August 24th with a brief time of prayer. Each team will be assigned a small one or two block area to conduct their prayer walk. The time of the prayer walk will be very short, approximately 30 minutes. Each team will come back to the fellowship hall where, as a large group, we will discuss the observations and conclusions.

I hope each of you will consider being part of a prayer walk team. It will be a non-confrontational and short walk. The information gained by each team will be valuable to the Vision Steering Committee and the congregation in the formation of the 10-year future vision plan.
