



March Good Neighbor News

Report from Good Neighbor Emergency Assistance

On March 10, GNEA board met at the Good Neighbor office at 613 Clark Ave. February was a slower month than usual; this is normal for Good Neighbor. For the last eight months Good Neighbor has provided rent and/or utilities assistance 240 households and 3,268 Healthy Food vouchers to 817 households. The agency has also distributed 141 gas vouchers in the same period of time. For FY 15/16, ASSET funding to GNEA will increase 2.31% for emergency rent/utilities program and 2.25% for the Healthy Food vouchers program. ACCESS (the local domestic

violence shelter) will be doing improvements to the three upstairs rooms at the office for outreach staff to conduct counseling and case management with clients.

Mike Fritz was contacted by a representative of "Raising Readers" if Good Neighbor could be an established site for distributing books. The facilities would be used as a site in which young readers of clients could obtain free books. As of the March meeting, this program had not been approved by the board or Raising Readers program.

The next board meeting will be held on April 22 at noon at the Good Neighbor Office at 613 Clark Ave. The date for the Choir Concert fundraiser will be November 8 and will be held at Collegiate Presbyterian Church.






