Letter from Pastor

What does it mean to be a Lutheran? Have you ever been asked that? Can you provide an accurate answer to the guestion? We hear the answer every Sunday, as our Law-Gospel sermon reminds us that we are sinners who have a wonderful Savior, who took our punishment to earn our forgiveness. However, we hear the core message of the Lutheran faith in a very special way each year on Reformation Sunday. You are saved because of what Jesus Christ did for you. You are saved because your Savior paid the price for your sins. You are saved by all that Jesus did, not because of anything that you do. "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith, and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast' (Ephesians 2:8-9).

Every October, we Lutherans are filled with excitement as we anticipate our Reformation Celebration. This special celebration is always held on the last Sunday in October. This year, October's last Sunday is a 4th Sunday, when we usually hold informal worship with music provided by the praise team. So that our Reformation worship on October 25 may include brass, organ and traditional worship, our worship format schedule in October will be revised, with informal worship with praise team music on October 18, the third Sunday of the month.

Plan to join us October 25 as we celebrate God's grace on Reformation Sunday. As Luther reminds us, "This is grace: the forgiveness of sins for the sake of the Lord Christ....Grace is freely given to the most undeserving...and is not obtained by any strenuous efforts, endeavors, or works, either small or great, not

even by the efforts of the best and most honorable of men....You dare not imagine that it was done for nothing or cost little....Grace and life were given you, but it meant bitter work for Him. It cost Him much. He earned it at the expense of His own body, blood and life."





Fall Sunday School Mission Offerings

This fall, the Sunday School mission offerings will go to support the Lutheran Heritage Foundation's **PEOPLE NEEDING GOD** – **sharing the Gospel with the kids of Papua New Guinea**. They have translated a Bible Studies book as well as the Catechism for children of PNG. For \$5 a book can be shared with a child of PNG. We have targeted a goal of \$575 enough



to match our roster of 115 kids from 3 year olds through 12th grade! We will collect offerings through the end of the year.

This is an aggressive goal – we discussed how children at St. Paul are provided with God's Word as 3 year olds, 3^{rd} graders, and 7^{th} graders. This is our opportunity to support others in the same way.

Stewardship News

Is there a difference between a talent and a spiritual gift?

The Bible notes that people are created in God's image, meaning, in part, that all people have certain talents and creative abilities that can be used to serve others. Those who come to faith in Christ also have at least one spiritual gift that is to be used for the common good of believers in the church and to reach those who do not know Christ.

Natural talents and spiritual gifts are closely related. A believer with a musical talent may also have the spiritual gift of encouragement and can use music to encourage and inspire people to grow closer to the Lord. A person who is a talented organizer may also be a Christian who has the gift of leadership and can oversee Christian activities in a way that grows believers and reaches unbelievers.

Examples of believers using natural talents abound. Nehemiah used his abilities to govern Jerusalem and rebuild the wall of the temple. Oholiab and Bezalel were gifted in artistic ability and craftsmanship to oversee construction of the Jewish tabernacle. Lydia used her ability as a "seller of purple goods" to support the ministry of Paul and his associates.

There appear to be two primary differences between talents and spiritual gifts. First, a talent can be available to either believers or unbelievers. Every person is created with certain abilities that can be of benefit to other people. However, it is believers in Jesus who are said to have spiritual gifts that benefit other believers and help in outreach to unbelievers.

Of course, natural talents and abilities given by God can and should be used to honor God as well. The ability to cook, sing, build houses, farm, teach children, work in engineering, serve in medical fields, and other talents are all God-given abilities that can be used to honor Him. While unbelievers can use these abilities for good, believers in Christ are further called to use these abilities, along with spiritual gifts, for the glory of God and to serve others

<u>1 Peter 4:10</u> As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace:


FOOD DONATIONS NEEDED
