
ATTENTION THRIVENT MEMBERS: The Board of Directors has voted to allow the designation of Thrivent Choice Dollars by individual mem-

Fall Sunday School Mission Offerings

This fall, the Sunday School mission offerings will go to support the Lutheran Heritage Foundation's **PEOPLE NEEDING GOD**– **sharing the Gospel with the kids of Papua New Guin- ea**. They have translated a Bible Studies book as well as the Catechism for children of PNG. For \$5 a book can be shared



with a child of PNG. We have targeted a goal of \$575, which is enough to match our roster of 115 kids from 3 year olds through 12th grade! We will collect offerings through the end of the year.

This is an aggressive goal – we discussed how children at St. Paul are provided with God's Word as 3 year olds, 3rd graders, and 7th graders. This is our opportunity to support others in the same way.


