Confirmation Sunday

"Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have" (1 Peter 3:15). "Whoever acknowledges me before men. I will also acknowledge him before mv Father in heaven" (Matthew 10:32). Confirmation Sunday is a very special occasion when we publicly profess our faith before others as we explain the reason for the hope which we have.
