Report on the District LWML convention by Gretchen Zitterich

I was not sure what I was getting into going to Camp Okoboji. The last time I went to "camp" I was 30 years younger, tended 8 first grade Brownie scouts, swatted mosquitos all day, and there was no beautiful lake. The word "primitive" comes to mind. However, being outdoors, next to nature, singing, laughter, and comradery did come to mind and lured me to the district LWML convention.

Inspiration came from God's word, speakers, pastors, and sisters in Christ. Celebrating the 70th year of Iowa West District Lutheran Women's Missionary League is a milestone. When the LWML was started the objective was to maintain and advance a greater mission consciousness among women of the LCMS and to gather funds for mission projects sponsored by our Synod. The founder's plan continues



today. The theme "Generations of Grace" certainly brought to mind what our fore-mothers experienced, the courage and trust they had, and passed on to us. What a testament to God's faithfulness. Ps. 100:5 says "...His faithfulness continues throughout all generations."

It was wonderful to meet 15 new YWR's...Young Women Representatives. St Paul's Sandy Van Nostrand represented our Boone Zone. Brenda Dryer, the new Young Women's Leader, introduced Breanna Wetzler, who spoke on her experience as a YWR rep for the district at the National convention last year.

Many inspirational speakers presented and inspired us, along with devotions, Bible study, and entertainment. Dr. Lamb reminded us that "life issues" are a mission field. God gives life value because He created redeemed and called us. We can serve those who are in need with love, support and care, educate those around us with the issues of life, be a witness by sharing God's love, and pray. Dr. Robert Roegner, pastoral counselor for LWML, reminded us that since the LWML was begun 75 years ago over 100 million in mites has been distributed to mission projects throughout the world.

One of these missions is the Hispanic Ministry in Des Moines. Rev Lincon Guerra and his wife Noemi Guerra gave testimony in music and word about this growing ministry through ESL classes, celebrations, and activities they hold in the Hispanic neighborhoods in Des Moines. We learned about Mercy Meals in Sioux City. 154,000 meals were assembled by volunteers and distributed through LCMS Orphan Grain Train; all due to a \$20,000 district grant from your mites. "Not Normal" Gary Thies inspired us with the miracles that have come out of Mission Central over the last 24 years. There were many other wonderful speakers and events.

We helped with servant events that may make a small miracle happen in someone's life. With my minimal skills and poor eyesight, I sat at one of 14 sewing machines donated and learned to make a cute diaper out of a T-shirt to be sent to Haiti! I soon moved on to something I could better handle...using Christmas cards to make books telling the story of Jesus. We also cut, pasted, and assembled Christian coloring books. IOWAY director Ellie Menz is always full of ideas. Did you know that IOWAY stands for Individual Outreach With Adults and Youth?

Thank you to our women who gave used purses to raise money for Mite Mission projects. Your 70 purses joined hundreds of others and brought in \$3,284.00. It was a fun way to raise money. To be sure, I did my part.

Our Mission statement: Appreciating God's gift of salvation and the Christian commitment of those who have gone before us, may Lutheran women today be motivated by Word and Sacrament to work in His kingdom, and joyfully pass our faith heritage and passion for acts of Mercy to future generations.
