Remember the Christmas hymn Go Tell It On The Mountain? This is what Christmas is all about - God's gift of love and forgiveness in Jesus, which we are blessed to be able to share with those around us! In this new year, we are launching "missional communities," small support groups to provide you with encouragement and joy as you spread the love of Christ in your daily life. These small groups of around 10-12 people will meet in homes on a regular basis (such as twice a month) to encourage each other in spreading the love of Jesus, just like the shepherds did! "And they returned [to their communities from Bethlehem]. glorifying and praising God for all the things that they had heard and seen, as it had been told to them [by the angel]" (Luke 2:20). Once the shepherds had witnessed Jesus, they went on their way and glorified God by going back to their villages and spreading the Word about the

newborn Savior. May God bless us today as we too "go tell it on the mountain, that Jesus Christ is born!"

A new year brings new opportunities. God has new opportunities planned for you this year, people He will place in your day so that you can share Christ's love with them. You can begin each day by asking, "Jesus, what opportunities will you present to me today to share your love with the people whose paths I cross?" Do you believe what the Scriptures say, that God has planned in advance good works for us to do (Ephesians 2:10)? Will you keep your eyes and ears open for the opportunities God is presenting you to join Jesus in sharing His love?

Where does the model for our missional communities come from? Our home groups are based on the early Christians, who met in homes to encourage each other, pray with each other, and support each other in their lives in the Lord. This model is reflected for us in the Book of Acts. Sunday,

January 14, our Missional Community Launch Sunday, the sermon will reflect on and discuss this Biblical model.

May God bless you and be with you in this new year, as you "go tell it on the mountain, over the hills and everywhere, go tell it on the mountain, that Jesus Christ is born!"

Missional Communities

Are you ready?

Ready to be discipled to be a follower of Jesus in our local community?

Ready to be trained to seek God's Kingdom and join Jesus' mission as part of your daily life?

Ready for deeper relationships with other like-minded members of our congregation?

These questions are related to the topic of missional communities as introduced by Pastor Greg Finke in the second workshop at St. Paul on "Joining Jesus on His Mission". After the workshop, two Missional Communities have started at St. Paul. These groups have been meeting regularly the past several months to support each other and share what we are learning on our mission with Jesus. In order to pursue the Great Commission of Jesus (make disciples of all nations – Matt. 28:19-20), we would like to set up additional missional communities so more and more people will be discipled through relationships with other every day missionaries.

In January, members of these first groups will be inviting you to join them in a missional community.

What is a missional community? What are the requirements/expectations?

The structure and requirements of a missional community are very simple:

meet in a small group (10-12 individuals) on a regular basis for as long as Jesus leads them.

be willing to share your experiences as you walk with Jesus.

groups will be led by one of the members of the first two missional communities.

What are the benefits for you in being part of a missional community at St. Paul:

gaining clarity about my true identity and purpose in Christ

receiving training for making the mission of God my personal mission as well


becoming more experienced and confident in living out my faith for the good of others in the community

Women's Ministry

LWML National 2017–2019 Mission Grant #4 — \$25,000 Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania (ELCT)

In southeastern Tanzania, many young women from villages do not attend school or have jobs, and so seek unskilled jobs in larger towns, often ending up involved in prostitution. Some end up with AIDS or unexpected pregnancies, with no means of supporting themselves. The ELCT has established the Bishop Makala Sewing Center to teach young women sewing, life skills, and the Gospel. The ELCT goal is to build classrooms with a 50 student capacity, along with a dormitory. Within one year of training, their sewing skills enable women to have pocket money, purchase a sewing machine, and buy materials to create sewn items to sell for income.
