After thanking her, & extending my appreciation for the prayer, her husband said I need to say a prayer also. This one was for AI to continue to have a good outlook & continued faith that the Lord would relieve the discomfort & give him a bit more security. It was wondrous!

I looked in my hand, & seeing a \$10.00 bill. I thanked him & we left the store. When we got to the car, I opened my hand and found two \$20.00 bills wrapped inside the ten! P.S. when I asked where the other three grandchildren were, we were told they were watching customers and paying their bills - it was their Christmas gift to those they paid for. This was their 3rd year to do this & next year the fourth child, the daughter would be joining them on this mission.

# **Family Life**

#### It takes a village, or... a Church!



It was last spring when I was sitting in my Youth Ministry class and discussing our assignment on the book, "Sticky Faith: Youth Ministry," that I remembered the old proverb, "It takes a village to raise a child." The proverb means that it takes an entire community of different people interacting with children in order for children to experience and grow in a safe environment. The villages would look out for the children. This does not mean an entire village is responsible for raising your children.

The same goes for the youth and families in our Church. It takes the entire congregation to assist in raising the children at St. Paul to become godly adults. It comes down to Intergenerational Relationships, despite the age differences that exists in our church, and in many other churches, each young person is greatly benefited when surrounded by a team of five adults. Sticky Faith calls this the new 5:1 ratio.

A shocking statistic that was published by Fuller Youth Institute was that close to 50% of youth in church will walk away from their church and faith after entering college. According to the FYI study, teens who had five or more adults from the church invested in them during the ages of 15 to 18 were less likely to leave the church after high school.

Some parents will be kicking off their study of Sticky Faith this month, giving them resources to equip and empower them to raise their children with a faith that sticks from adolescence into adulthood and beyond. Part of those resources includes helping find welcoming church members that are willing to commit to invest in the youth faith stages in a little, medium or big way.

Now is the time to step forward, assist the families, and make those relationships with the youth in our church. Be known to them by name, through the love and compassion you show them. Talk to them, approach them, and work with them. It's time now to be visible, and have those discussions with them: about Jesus, God, and their lives. Make the conversation about them and how they view their faith.

You need assistance? You need more information? You want to know what you can do specifically, please contact me, let's meet and discuss the options! I am always open!

In addition to collecting offerings we are asking our children and their families to please pray for them as they prepare for their first assignment with LBT, serving the Veekuhane people of Botswana.

## **Youth**

#### **Blessed beyond Blessed: A National Youth Gathering Update!**

On behalf of all the youth and families participating in the 2019 National Youth Gathering (NYG) we would like to express our sincere gratitude for the blessings that St. Paul members have showered us with.

The 2019 NYG will be held in Minneapolis, Minnesota July 11-15, 2019. We currently have 11 youth and 4 adults working on their 3-year fundraising cycle to cover the estimated \$15,800 cost for us to attend the gathering. All participants are required to pay \$400 for registration. The total estimated fundraising amount comes out to be \$10,200.

Each year we have a variety of fundraisers that we bring to the congregation and the community. And each year St. Paul members step up and blow us away with their willingness to contribute and invest in the youth who will be attending. This month we wanted to say THANK YOU! Thank you for your continued support of the youth and the NYG participants. Your compassion and love for the youth to expand their faith is appreciated, and we are overwhelmed with excitement to share with you our fundraising totals.

This year we took a leap of faith on a few new fundraisers: Our Duct Tape Challenge (November 12<sup>th</sup> during the HOPE Gift Market) brought in \$87; our Pick and Pay (Sucker Tree) has brought in \$130 so far; our Candy Bar sales have brought in a net profit of \$100; our Advent dinner you contributed \$234; and out first ever Gift Wrapping brought in \$132. However, the largest fundraiser to date was our very first Trivia Night (on January 13<sup>th</sup>), adding the registration fees, mulligans, concessions, bonus rounds and silent auction, Trivia Night brought in contributions totaling: **\$1,906**! WOW, that was awesome!

To date, after 1½ years into the 3 year fundraising cycle, we have raised \$6,017! And it is all because of the members at St. Paul and your generosity. Way to go! We are blessed beyond blessed to have such generous members at this church!


