

#### **A Letter from your Pastor**

Members of St. Paul,

Here in lowa, we can understand the agricultural images used in Scripture. Remember what Jesus says about the work of His kingdom with passages that compare Christ's mission to a field? Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field" (Matthew 9:37-38).

Thomas and I will work together to serve our Lord and Savior and to feed His sheep here at St. Paul. Join us for the feast! Come to the park for pancakes, sausages, coffee/juice after the 8:30 service at church, or join us for breakfast and stay for the 10:00 outdoor service!



## LWML National 2017–2019 Mission Grant #10 — \$100,000 Christian Eldercare Home in Haiti


Haiti is a nation in need of special attention. Since the earthquake in 2010, Lutheran baptisms in Haiti have been multiplied beyond expectations and Lutheran church attendance

is increasing. However, physical and spiritual needs of our brothers and sisters in Christ are left unmet. A center for the elderly people who have outlived their families, and some of whom are currently living in tents and deplorable conditions, is planned to be built on the same property where an orphanage was constructed in 2014. The children will have grandparents and the elderly will have children to make them smile. The center, built with funds supplied by this grant, would result in a dwelling with clean water, suitable waste containment, beds, food, and care for these forgotten people. Ministry in Mission desires to fulfill the intent of creating a true community for Haitian Lutherans by providing a safe living environment for all Haitians in the surrounding area and particularly the forgotten elderly society.
