Are there Youth in Church?

Recently I came across a blog published by *Lutheran Pub* titled, "Why Are There No Kids in Church?" This is one man's opinion on why we are seeing less youth coming to church. The author, Joseph Goodroad, took a good look at the old favorite reasons of why youth do not come, "Maybe church is taking too long," "Maybe the liturgy and traditional music is too old-hat." He then drops the excuse given to him that it is hopeless to try to get youth back because, "kids have changed." Have they? Have the youth in our church changed so much that we are not able to reach them? Or, is it that we think we know what they want without asking them? Have we really tried to reach the youth?

This is what I have been hitting hard in the past few months, it is up to all of us to engage our youth and make them feel comfortable with coming to church each week. This month I am hoping to reach the parents and reach some of the members that can also engage the parents and young adults in our congregation. So, let's look at some reasons why, not just youth, but young adults do not return to church.

Being apathetic towards Christianity: Parents drag their youth, or young adults drag themselves, to church because "That's what we do on Sunday", and then never speak of Christ for the remainder of the week.

That's it. I said "reasons", but that is the one and only reason. All other "reasons" are the excuses that lead to this one reason. As Christians we have become too apathetic towards Christianity.

How do we change it? 1. Lead by example! Teach them about their faith throughout the week. 2. Put family priorities in proper order, showing your children and yourselves the importance of learning about Jesus and His love for us. 3. Prayer – have a more concrete prayer before eating, not just "Come, Lord Jesus be our guest." Prayer or devotional time before bed time? (These are not just for parents and youth but for everyone!) 4. When you go to church, explain that you go to receive God's gifts in Word and sacraments. When your children are in Sunday School join a Bible Study - lead by example! 5. Demonstrate to them that faith IS important – read your Bible!

Now, I do not like to be a "doom and gloom individual" I am excited to see so many families and youth attending our church, Midweek and Sunday School. It is AWESOME! I do think we have some small steps to take to make it even better! As a congregation we can be there to help sup-

port each other, encourage and empower each other to grow in our faith. This includes being there to assist the families to teach their children about Jesus.

I was not here in time to meet Dave Cavanaugh, however I have heard about his "Hot for Jesus" motto. St. Paul I'm calling you on you to carry on with this motto – we need to get Hot for Jesus!

SAFE: Did You Know?

What's the definition of a Child, Youth, Dependent Adult, and Adult?

Many members wonder what the difference is between a child and a youth, and what is the difference between an adult and a dependent adult. Well, here are the definitions as outlined in our SAFE Policy: Child – any individual under thirteen (13) years of age. Youth- any individual who is at least thirteen (13) years old but not yet eighteen (18) years old or any individual who is eighteen (18) years old but still in high school. Dependent Adult – an individual eighteen (18) years of age or older who is incapable of adequate self-care due to physical or mental conditions and requires assistance from other people. Adult – any individual at least eighteen (18) years of age.

What does our policy say about Child Abuse?

Child abuse is defined in the Iowa Code, section 232.68. The victim of child abuse is a person under the age of 18 who has suffered one or more of the categories of child abuse as defined in the Iowa Iaw (physical, mental injury, sexual abuse, denial of critical care, child prostitution, presence of illegal drugs, manufacturing or possession of dangerous substance, and bestiality in the presence of a minor). The term child, in this definition as it applies to the SAFE Policy at St. Paul Lutheran Church, includes youth and dependent adults.





"Book to Know to Help You Grow"

Sixteen ladies met at the home of Shirley Tice to discuss *The Nightingale* by Kristin Hannah. Everyone liked the book. Someone said that the characters in the book seemed so real that we discussed them as real people. For many of the women there, it gave a different perspective on what it was like to be a women in France during the time of the Nazi occupation.

Our November book is *Luther and Katharina: A Novel of Love and Rebellion*. The Barnes and Noble description is: A Christy Award-winning novel chronicling the forbidden romance between Martin Luther and his wife, Katharina von Bora, set against the Protestant Reformation of the sixteenth century. She was a nun of noble birth. He

was a heretic, a reformer, and an outlaw of the Holy Roman Empire. In the 16th century, nun Katharina von Bora's fate fell no further than the Abbey. Until she read the writings of Martin Luther. His sweeping Catholic church reformation— condemning a cloistered life and promoting the goodness of marriage—awakened her desire for everything she'd been forbidden. Including Martin Luther himself. Despite the fact that the attraction and tension between them is undeniable, Luther holds fast to his convictions and remains isolated, refusing to risk anyone's life but his own. And Katharina longs for love, but is strong-willed. She clings proudly to her class distinction, pining for nobility over the heart of a reformer. They couldn't be more different. But as the world comes tumbling down around them, and with Luther's threatened life a constant strain, these unlikely allies forge an unexpected bond of understanding, support and love. Together, they will alter the religious landscape forever.


