A Letter from your Pastor

BEHOLD THE MAN: A LENTEN JOURNEY

Friends in the Lord,

This month we begin the season of Lent once again. Although the season is always the same, our series each year does change. This year our Lenten series will focus on the theme: "Behold the man!" These words were proclaimed by Pontius Pilate, who unwittingly offered the shortest yet most profound sermon ever recorded.

This will be our endeavor this Lententide -- Behold the man: God in human flesh, Jesus. His incarnation will provide the basis for our meditation and proclamation. We will fix our eyes on the man Jesus, contemplating the inescapable fact that God became man. The Second Person of the eternal triune God, "by whom all things were made," became a living, breathing, flesh-and-blood human being, a man.

This Lent, we will consider what it means that God became man. In preparation for the celebration of a real flesh-

and-blood resurrection, we will consider the body of Jesus that exists in order to be nailed to a cross. The spiritual, bodyless Son of God became the embodied, enfleshed incarnate Son of Mary. In Jesus, God has human flesh, a body, just like you. What could be more profound?

Each week, we will consider a different aspect of the body of Jesus Christ. What does it mean that, in Jesus, God has hands, feet, lungs, lips, eyes, and ears? Our midweek Lenten worship services will be held each Wednesday evening at 7:00 p.m. beginning on Ash Wednesday, March 6. Join us as we "Behold the Man," the man who is also God, our Lord and Savior Jesus!

Family Life

Huddle Up! The Family Prayer Huddle

No, it is not football time yet! The Super Bowl just got over, but it is always a great time for a Family Huddle!

When do you pray as a family? At Bedtime? Family devotions? Do you pray at dinner time? How often do you say "the common table prayer"? How often do we ramble off the prayer and not really think of the words that we address to our great God? Even at church, the Lord's Prayer sometimes is said without thought.

Formal prayers have their place, but informal prayers are just as important! What a blessing it is to have a Father who knows us by name (Isaiah 43:1). Who loves us no matter what (Ephesians 2:4-5). WE have a Father who longs to hear from us (Jeremiah 33:3).

Insert "The Family Huddle"! Take time, before dinner, before bedtime, anytime that fits for the family, to pray together and huddle up. Bring the family close, in a circle, with your arms around each other's shoulders like a sports team. Remember, you are actually a team! Bow your heads and pray "homemade" prayers about any topic. Pray for a friend or relative who is going through a tough situation.

Pray for school or church. Or simply pray prayers of praise to God!

Jesus gave us a great example when the disciples asked how they should pray. In Matthew 6:9-13 and Luke 11:2 -4, He tells us that we can address Almighty God as "Dad", "our Father".

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 tells us: "Always be JOYFUL. Never stop praying. Whatever happens, give thanks, because it is God's will in Christ Jesus that you do this."

When your children see you turn to God in good times and bad, when they hear you talk to God in an authentic, conversational way, then they learn that God is right there with them. That he cares about you and that you can turn to Him in ALL situations.

Try it! Gather your family in a big group hug and thank God for each person. Talk to our Father about whatever concerns you. Be a family who prays together!




But we wanted to announce that this year we will be presenting: "Miraculous Mission:

LWML National 2017–2019 Mission Grant #18 — \$75,000 Restoration Programs for Native Hawaiians

Most people think of Hawaii as paradise, but to Native Hawaiians, known as Kanaka, Hawaii, it is quite a different place. In recent years, the number of homeless people in Hawaii has grown, with poverty rising, leaving few people in the middle class. Most of the ministry work is done in urban areas by non-Kanaka men and women to non-Kanaka people. To successfully engage the Kanaka people in the Christian faith and to provide the support and assistance that Kanaka people need to begin to overcome the serious social issues that plague them, missionaries must embrace the Kanaka culture. Clarence DeLude III (Kanaka), who is on staff with Lutheran Indian Ministries, is enrolled in the Cross-Cultural Ministry Center Program at Concordia University, Irvine, California, which leads to ordination. As a called and ordained servant of the Word, Clarence, a Native Hawaiian, will be used as God's instrument in bringing the Gospel of Jesus Christ to his fellow Kanaka people. Grant funds would be used for scholarships for Clarence, VBS/Teen Camp, on-going Bible study, and Sexual Abuse and Leadership Training (SALT) seminars.



Workers at a homeless shelter in Waianae: Within a three-mile radius of the church, there are three homeless shelters, as well as 450-800 people living within the bushes of the homeless campsites. Within this community of 13,000, 29% of those under age 18 live below the poverty line. Estimates of more than 7,500 people live on Oahu's streets and beaches.

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
