## A Letter from your Pastor

Do you like numbers? I'm not talking about the book of Numbers, just numbers in general. This is the time of year when remembering numbers can be helpful. For instance, think about the number 3 in relation to Jesus Christ. The Bible records 3 specific temptations the devil threw Jesus' way. Jesus' public ministry lasted for 3 years. Peter denied Jesus 3 times and was, after Jesus resurrection, 3 times questioned about whether he loved Jesus. Jesus died on a cross, the middle cross of 3 crosses. Jesus lay in the tomb for 3 days and rose again on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day.

Other numbers also play a part in the passion story. Think about the number 2. Two men who were crucified had their bones broken (one did not, Jesus, in fulfillment of the Scriptures). Two men took Christ down from the cross, wrapped His body for burial and laid Him in the tomb (do you remember who they were?). Two men ran to the tomb on Easter morning to see what had happened (I'm sure you remember them). Two men walked with the risen Jesus on the road to Emmaus.

You see the value in thinking about numbers? Recently, we submitted a report to the Synod, a report that includes many numbers. For instance, the report indicates what percentage of our St. Paul membership is in different age brackets. Here are the numbers for our members: birth to 18 = 23%, 19-34 = 17%, 35-49 = 18%, 50-64 = 17%, 65+ = 25%. Many experts say a church is healthy

when it has a broad and fairly even distribution across all age brackets. We do! Our membership percentage is fairly close in all 5 age brackets. Another interesting number we report about our congregation is our average worship attendance. Year after year, our average Sunday worship attendance is fairly consistent, averaging right around 200 people in worship per Sunday. This most recent year our average Sunday worship attendance was 202 per Sunday. Our worship attendance is consistently maintaining, whereas unfortunately the common trend in our church body and many others is church attendance that is rapidly shrinking.

There is value in thinking about numbers. So think lastly about the number 1. Jesus Christ died one time for the sins of the world. *"He sacrificed for their sins once for all when He offered Himself.... We have been made holy through the sacrifice of the body of Jesus Christ once for all"* (Hebrews 7:27, 10:10). Jesus had one life to give and He gave it for you. Why? Because you are number one in His eyes. Because He wanted you to receive life's one greatest gift—eternal life. May God bless you as you celebrate the great news of the wondrous gift you have received through Jesus' death and resurrection!

## Family Life

### Dinner Talk!

I grew up in a large family, where my mother did not work outside the home, so dinner was always a feast! I loved dinner time! It was always a time for us to share, my brothers and sisters to argue, a time of day when it was loud, but also a time when we sat down as a family. As years went by and my brothers and sisters moved on, and that time went away. Mom went to work, I was in high school and going to activities, there were no more conversations, it all ended. And, I miss it!

Do you still have family dinners around the table? Are there beginning to become fewer and fewer times that the whole family is there? Most importantly, what do you talk about?

I have heard over the years that family dinner time is no longer important to the “modern families” of today. They have busy and changing work schedules, and youth have more activities than ever before, that families have found it necessary to use dinner time for other obligations. So, when do families find time to talk? When do parents find time to “get to know” their children, their dreams, their needs and wants, their fears?

Children do not need a lot of time to express themselves to their parents. So I put this forward: do you have 7 ½ minutes? Yes, I asked for minutes – not hours! What if your family spent 7 ½ minutes every day sitting down together at the kitchen or dining room table and offering instruction, guidance, and encouragement? Spending 7 ½ minutes around the table and asking them what they need will provide you with material and subjects you need to teach your family.

Have conversations about, and ask questions of one another based on these 7 dimensions: B.E.L.I.E.F.S.

**B (body):** Does anyone in the family have special physical needs this week? Can you implement a family walk to get more exercise? (1 Corinthians 3:16-17 & 6:19-20; Romans 12:1-2)

**E (emotion):** Is anyone depressed or anxious about anything? How can you introduce humor or laughter into your time? (Philippians 4:6-7; Romans 12:2; 2 Corinthians 10:5)

**L (livelihood):** What do dad and mom do for a living? What do all of the kids want to do as adults? (Deuteronomy 5:12-15; Proverbs 16:28; Colossians 3:23)

**I (intellect):** How is everyone doing in school? Does anyone need help studying? (Proverbs 1:5, 1:7, 10:17, 18:15; Daniel 5:14)

**E (environment):** Is there anyway to change or improve the home environment to accommodate the needs of all or to provide a more peaceful and comfortable setting? (Genesis 1:28; Luke 12:27-30; Psalm 127)

**F (family and friends):** How can your family open their home and arms to others to promote lasting relationships? (1 Timothy 5:8; Ephesians 6; John 15:13)

**S (spiritual):** Can you as parents enhance the spiritual growth of your children by enjoying Scripture reading or devotional studies together? (Colossians 1:9-10; Matthew 5:6; Psalm 1:1-3).

I hope we can all find that 7 ½ minutes and take time to have conversations with each other, and I hope you find as much joy in family dinner time as I did in my youth.

**Prayer Cards for Kids:** We have two versions of the Prayer Cards for Kids. The first version is the “I can Talk to God” prayer cards. These sets (2 different sets – 1 for boys, 1 for girls) are available for the beginner readers. Large print with easier words. The other set “31 Prayers for Kids” (2 full sets available!) are for the 2<sup>nd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> grade youth, giving them a prayer a day!



**Sarah Young Devotionals:** We have three different “Jesus Devotionals” written by Sarah Young. Each devotional (Jesus Calling, Jesus Today, or Jesus Always) is a full 365 day devotional that can be used as a book to read with your child, or if your child is able, to read by themselves. ### LWML National 2017–2019 Mission Grant #19 — \$50,000 RECONNECT to the Body of Christ

The congregations of Texas District Circuit 28 have a great desire to work together as one group in training mission workers to share the Word and unite these congregations and communities. The Rio Grande Valley of Texas shares the border with Mexico and has a large Hispanic population, many of whom are among the poorest of poor, at risk and unchurched. They have developed a long-range plan to assist the struggling congregations in reaching out to the communities to bring the Word into the homes of hurting families. The first step in the plan has been realized with the arrival of a Director of Christian Education (DCE) that will be serving the circuit – not just an individual church. With this in place, the next stages can begin by training leaders within the congregations in a mission and ministry model utilized by a local, thriving congregation, building campus relationships with the 50,000 students attending local colleges, and conducting community mercy projects. These funds will assist in the project startup costs, training materials, transportation costs, scholarships, and other incurred expenses of the training program.

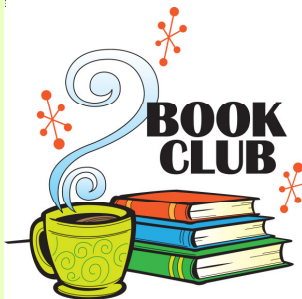
We normally collect mites for missions on the 1st Sunday of each month. For more information about LWML go to [www.lwml.org](http://www.lwml.org).

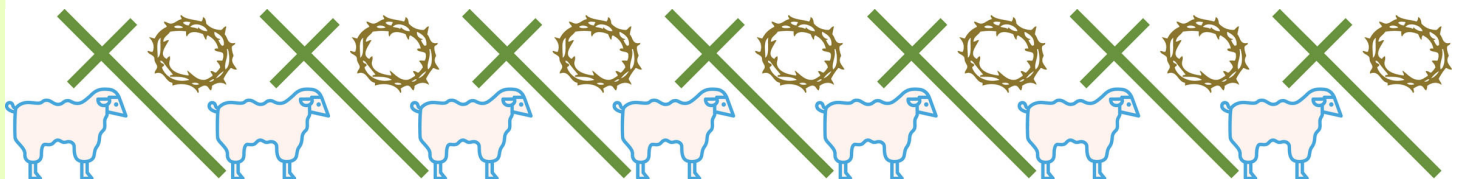
