

New Sunday Morning Adult Bible Study

After His resurrection, just before His ascension, Jesus shared His parting words with His disciples. What did Jesus say? "Go make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to observe all things that I have passed on to you" (Matthew 28:19-20). 
NEW Parent Study Starts September 8th!

You've tried behavior modification, discipline, various rules, and supposedly biblical methods. If you read one more blogger's take on how to be a great parent, you might have a panic attack. What's your next move?

Join with other parents (who are just as stressed as you are!) and learn how to make your faith in Jesus and your hope in the gospel the core of your parenting. As you grow in prayer, repentance, and trust, you will discover yourself becoming a better and happier parent.

The Gospel Centered Parent uses personal illustrations and interactive questions to help parents come to grips with their own sin, the sin of their children, and how they can teach and love in the midst of life's brokenness. It trains parents to put their hope in God rather than in sound parenting principles; encourages the prayer, repentance, and trust - which actually produces great parents. It brings parents together to teach and learn from one another in a gospel-shaped community.

Perfect for busy parents; lessons require no extra work outside of the group setting. This 9-session small group resource will help parents apply the gospel of Jesus



Christ to their families. Each lesson looks at parenting through the lens of God's grace for parents and children and gives parents a gospel-center to their parenting. Parents will learn how to live out the biblical principles of faith, repentance, and faithfulness to their calling as parents with their children.



LWML National 2019–2021 Mission Grant #1 — \$80,000 Water and the Word for Rural Schools in Kenya

In 2008, a man from Nebraska traveling in East Africa saw the need for clean water and sought a way to help. Through contact with a social worker and educator in Nakuru, Kenya, he devised a system of installing water harvesting equipment (rain gutters and tanks), filters, hand washing stations and clean water storage to be installed in schools in Kenya. In 2016, members of The Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod from Nebraska took over the management of the project. They visit Kenya every year, traveling to schools assessing their water needs. Teams from the United States install rain gutters and tanks for storage. Hand washing stations and clean water "buckets" are placed in every classroom. They teach personal hygiene, handwashing and the importance of drinking only clean water. WASH clubs, made up of students and staff are formed to be responsible for the clean water program. The

grant will help the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Kenya (ELCK) to extend their ministry of Word and Sacrament by expanding the clean water project for their schools and orphanages.
