A Letter from your Pastor

What does it mean to be a Lutheran? Have you ever been asked that? Can you provide an accurate answer to the question? We hear the answer every Sunday, as our Law-Gospel sermon reminds us that we are sinners who have a wonderful Savior, who took our punishment to earn our forgiveness. However. we hear the core message of the Lutheran faith in a very special way each year on Reformation Sunday. You are saved because of what Jesus Christ did for you. You are saved because your Savior paid the price for your sins. You are saved by all that Jesus did, not because of anything that you do. "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith, and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast" (Ephesians 2:8-9).

Every October, we Lutherans are filled with excitement as we anticipate our Reformation Celebration. This special celebration is always held on the last Sunday in October. This year, October's last Sunday is a 4th Sunday, when we usually hold informal worship with music provided by the praise team. So that our

"Greetings from Stewardship! Mark you calendars...a special Stewardship emphasis will be held at both services on October 20, with recently retired Rev.

Mark Hansen of Humboldt preaching stewardship sermons that day. (Pastor Jenks will lead the liturgy that day.)

Did you know that Iowa District West is one of the top districts in providing financial aid to students attending our Concordia schools? The 2019 District budgets includes \$250,000 for financial aid, most of which comes from restricted/endowment sources and LWML.

The District also helps pastors and professional church workers after they graduate. Since 2014, the District has paid out over \$250,000 in grants to reduce the educational indebtedness of 36 LCMS rostered workers in the District (89 individual applications; workers can currently apply up to 5 years). Deadline to apply is November 1. This is possible, thanks to generous people in the District who have remembered the District in their estate plans."

LWML National 2019–2021 Mission Grant #2 — \$100,000 Teach Me Too – Preschoolers with Learning Needs in Austin

Lutheran Special Education Ministries (LSEM) has seen a growing desire for early intervention support of children with learning needs. In 1976 LSEM began serving children with special learning needs in the Detroit area and has since expanded programs and services to include a presence in Lutheran schools nationwide. Their pilot program is Let It Shine Academy at Bethany Lutheran Church, Austin, Texas. The Teach Me Too program was designed to administer intervention strategies, address the unique needs of children with autism spectrum disorder and other unique needs such as hyperactivity issues, decreased or delayed social skills, developmental or speech delays, sensory integration difficulties, or other learning differences. As a resource for families, this program provides assessments, consultations, and materials to help children on an individual basis. This grant would help fund Teach Me Too, expand the Let It Shine Academy, provide teacher

training, and offer scholarship funding for children whose families cannot afford the cost of the Let It Shine Program.


