### Lenten Services begin Ash Wednesday, February 26

This month we again begin the season of Lent. Services of reflection will be held each Wednesday at 7:00 p.m. Our theme this Lent will be "Eyes on Jesus." Each year during the Lenten season we fix our eyes on Jesus, remembering the great love He showed for us and the grand sacrifice He made for us. We think about what we see when we see Jesus. However, when the people in the Passion narrative looked at Jesus, what did they see?

This year's series "Eyes on Jesus" invites us to look at Jesus through the eyes and viewpoints of various people who also lived through the events of the Passion. What did these "eyewitnesses" see? Did they see Jesus in a manner that misunderstood Him? Did they recognize Jesus as the Son of God, come from above, the divine in human flesh? Using selected Scripture passages from the Gospel of Mark, we will be challenged to consider what we see in Jesus.

Join us for these special devotional services of worship Wednesday evenings in Lent! Our Ash Wednesday service will

include the imposition of ashes and the celebration of the Lord's Supper, and will run about an hour. Other weeks in Lent our devotional service will be around 45 minutes or so. Come worship with us this Lent as we remember Christ's suffering and sacrifice to bring us God's love and forgiveness. Let us look to the cross, and see Jesus, who paid our sins' cost!

### **Wellness Team**

"So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God." I Corinthians 10:31

February is Heart month! Do you know that what you do to protect your heart can also help prevent or treat diabetes, decrease cancer risks and protect your brain? Healthy eating is a part of this, along with moving your body on a regular basis, managing stress, not smoking and getting enough sleep. We know that you want to be healthier!



What can you work on this month? Did you know the American Heart Association encourages most adults to eat at least two non-fried fish meals weekly and a meatless meal once a week? Do you do this already? If not, maybe you could aim to eat non-fried fish at least once weekly. Or, try a meatless meal once a month? The rewards of small changes can give big rewards over time!

At the "Taste of Wellness," we enjoyed the Spinach Lasagna, which supports efforts to eat vegetables, whole grains and go meatless. Maybe try this simple fish recipe to add some fish into your routine:

#### **Oven Fried Fish**

½ cup cornflake crumbs


1 Tablespoon oil (such as canola oil)

½ teaspoon Italian seasoning

1/8 teaspoon black pepper

1# fish fillets (like halibut, sole, snapper, etc)

Preheat oven to 450 degrees. Spray baking sheet with no stick spray.



Complete the meal with a baked sweet potato, steamed broccoli, a mixed fresh fruit cup, and a glass of no/low fat milk.

# Homegrown Fruits of the Spirit: Growth Begins in the Home

As far back as the Old Testament, Moses implored families to repeat the words of God to their children – to "Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up" (Deuteronomy 6:7). Even Martin Luther, in his Small Catechism, instructed the pastors to work with the parents, to encourage them to teach their children the Word. This month we look at scripture that reflects on the character of our family members and forgiveness in our teaching of our youth.

If our youth are little fruit trees, then we must consider our homes and church to be the orchard in which they grow. We (church workers, parents, and congregation members) all have a part in watering the orchard. Paul wrote in the New Testament, "Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord" (Ephesians 6:4). The Greek word for "training" in this verse means "to counsel", and refers to placing the mind in a proper place, as to reason with our youth by "warning."

This is where we see a clear distinction between raising youth with natural character traits and cultivating the supernatural fruit of the Spirit. Raising youth with character traits is not a bad thing. Yet in the natural world, one character trait at the expense of another can be challenging. For example: teaching youth to be nice to others is noble. But if the youth become nice because they are afraid of rejection, the character trait is built on selfish motives. Instead, when we teach our youth that kindness means we look out for the best interests of others, we can cultivate the supernatural work of the Spirit in our youth to faithfully confront their friends for wrong behavior in a gentle, kind, and loving way.

Granted, this happens when we (church workers, parents, congregational members) "remain in" the vine ourselves and lead our youth "in the way of the Master" (Ephesians 6:4).

How does it make you feel when your children do not want to read the Bible or pray? How have you viewed your role as being a discipler to the youth? As parents, and as adults in general, WE WILL MESS UP! We all say things we regret. We might yell or be inconsistent. However, as Romans 8 confirms, beating ourselves up for it does no good. "Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death" (Romans 8: 1-2).

In fact, research has shown that if we can be emotionally safe with youth just forty percent of the time, we can have a better relationship with them. Why? Because research shows that "repair" is one of the greatest strategies we have with youth. What does the Bible say about repair? IT calls it forgiveness, and it tells us to practice it --- A LOT!

#### **APPLICATION:**

Moring Prayer: Heavenly Father, multiply the fruit and work of my children's hands. Give me insight and understanding to raise my children in such a way that they hear those most coveted words, "Well done, good and faithful servant!" (Matthew 25:21)

**Bedtime Question:** If you could choose one thing to do together as a family this weekend, what would it be?





# **Women's Ministry**

#### THE ROEGNERS HAVE ARRIVED IN ISRAEL- PARTNERSHIPS . . . GOD'S PLAN!

Kristi and I have just arrived in Tel Aviv, Israel, to begin our work as Bible Teachers. So much has happened over the past four years since God called Kristi and me to Israel, to make this possible. Not the least of which is the untold hundreds of "partnerships" that have been critical to see God's plan realized.

God's plan has included two very important Scripture verses in our lives. Paul in Romans 1:16, shared the foundation of God's plan, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes: first to the Jew, then to the Gentile" (NIV). Then Jeremiah in his letter to the Exiles in 29:11, lays it all out and tells us it is God's plan and not our own, "For I know the plans I have for you', declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future'" (NIV). No doubt, it is God's plan, that has inspired all these partnerships that have made it possible to be in Israel, on behalf of God and His plan through The Apple of His Eye Mission Society, a Recognized Service Organization (RSO) of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS).

Of course, being granted RSO status by the LCMS is a great privilege, a great partnership! Being able to BOLDLY declare Y'shua as Messiah, through Word and Sacraments, a part of God's plan now has begun. Thank you, LCMS! As with any new work startup financial support is critical. Our arrival into Israel a few days ago was made possible by the partnership of thousands of women (and a few men) from the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML). Through those mighty mites, a grant of \$100,000 was approved in Des Moines in 2015 and presented to the AOHE in Albuquerque in 2017. Two and half years later, BOLDLY declaring Y'shua as Messiah, God's plan that now has begun. Thank you, LWML!

As a ministry like the AOHE moves into a new place, like Israel, it is important to look for opportunities to partner with ministries already there who have themselves followed God's plan, "to the Jew first." Some of these ministries have been around in Israel, for decades and are able to bring to the table experience, relationships, and the ability to assist a newer ministry like the AOHE. One such ministry is the Norwegian Church Ministry to Israel (NCMI), founded in 1844 in Stavanger, Norway. NCMI is a Lu-

theran based organization with the purpose of awakening Christians to their responsibility for the Jewish people, proclaiming the Gospel and serving Jews in Christian love. NCMI has partnered with the AOHE by applying to the Israeli government and using two of their A3 Religious Visas on our behalf. Of course, as you know by now, those multi-entry visas were approved for us in December.

Finally, the last partner as part of God's plan I want to mention is the partner-ship that Kristi and I have with You! You, pray for us regularly. You, who financially support us, allowing us to travel to Israel, and serve God here. Your prayers have spiritually sustained us. Your financial gifts have helped us reach full funding. You, who will continue to pray and support us in 2020 and beyond. Today, we are BOLDLY declaring Y'shua as Messiah, a part of God's plan. Thank you, ALL OF YOU! - In Y'shua **Bob Roegner**

# **LWML National 2019–2021 Mission Grant #6 — \$100,000**Mobile Medical Mercy Mission Bus for Guatemala

While Guatemala is a beautiful country, many people suffer in extreme poverty. Over 50% of the children are malnourished and have no access to any form of medical or dental care. Most have no pre-natal or post-natal care and often die from preventable diseases. Immanuel Lutheran Church, Hood River, Oregon and the Lutheran Church of Guatemala have partnered together to share God's physical and spiritual healing with as many souls as possible. They have developed a network of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod partner churches to send medical professionals and mission teams to Guatemala on short term medical mission trips. In order to reach these isolated villages, they need the right tool, namely a Mobile Medical Mercy Mission Bus. The funds will be used to purchase and retrofit a bus with medical equipment. Bible school equipment will also be purchased enabling the teams to heal both the physical and spiritual needs of the Guatemalan children. While the physicians tend to their physical needs, the ministers and lay leaders go into the villages and set up bible classes, VBS and worship services. Child Beyond International will continue to financially support this ministry.
