There are many family favorites that will fill our homes with wonderful smells and tastes! Yet, we need to honor the Lord by taking care of our bodies. Consider 1 Corinthians 6:15: "Do




you not know that your bodies are members of Christ himself?" So, again I remind you, to eat regularly and to eat a variety of healthy foods. Listen to your body...eat when you are hungry, eat slowly, chew deliberately, taste and enjoy all those special Christmas foods, stopping when you've had the right amount for you! Make this season a healthy one by taking care of yourself! Give yourself the gift of TLC—make realistic plans, don't overcommit, get enough rest and try to get in a walk. Bundle up, get outside if it is safe for you to do so, and get some fresh air!

### A fun holiday bread... Cranberry Bread

- 2 cups flour
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup sugar (or use  $\frac{1}{4}$  cup sugar and  $\frac{1}{4}$  cup sugar substitute, like Stevia in the raw)
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- ½ teaspoon salt
- Juice and rind of 1 medium orange
- 2 teaspoons melted margarine or butter
- Hot water
- 1 egg, beaten slightly with fork before stirring into batter
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 cup cranberries, halved or chopped coarsely
- 1/2 cup chopped walnuts or pecans
- Preheat oven to 350 degrees.



Cut aluminum foil to fit bottom of loaf pan. Spray pan with no stick spray. Add batter. Bake 1 hr or until toothpick comes out clean. Cool pan on rack for 10 minutes. Remove bread from pan. Store in airtight container or sealed bag when cool.

Everything about New Yorker Joy seemed ill-matched for an Oxford don and the beloved writer of Narnia, yet their minds bonded over their letters. Embarking on the adventure of her life, Joy traveled from America to England and back again, facing heartbreak and poverty, discovering friendship and faith, and against all odds, finding a love that even the threat of death couldn't destroy.

In this masterful exploration of one of the greatest love stories of modern times, we meet a brilliant writer, a fiercely independent mother, and a passionate woman who changed the life of this respected author and inspired books that still enchant us and change us. Joy lived at a time when women weren't meant to have a voice—and yet her love for Jack gave them both voices they didn't know they had.

### **Tenderheart and Explorers Adventure Into the Prairie**

This fall AHG held a field trip to West Peterson Park and a service project at Doolittle Prairie. There the girls learned about native prairie plants and were able to collect and smell them. ### PiPa Badge Workshop and Camp-In

On October 2 the Pioneers and Patriots had a camp-in at Camp Pine Lake. There they completed the majority of the Outdoor Cooking badge. Prior to the camp-in, the girls had to have the Fire Safety and Fire Building badge finished. At the camp-in they were in charge of building and maintaining the fire. They cooked a total of three meals and three desserts. Dinner was chicken, vegetables, and potato foil meals with breadsticks cooked over the fire. Breakfast was eggs cooked on homemade camp stoves made out of tin cans. Lunch was dutch oven macaroni and cheese and skillet "Tatcos" (tater tot nachos). Desserts included cherry and apple pudgie pies, foil s'more cones in the fire, and apple crisp in the dutch oven. The Pipas also ice dyed white face mask using the colors red and blue. First they laid the masks on cooling racks over a bucket. Then they placed the ice on top and added tye-dye powder. As the ice melted, it created a tye-dye effect. After letting them sit overnight, the girls rinsed out the remaining dye. During free time the girls went hiking, played gaga ball and carpet ball, and enjoyed the outdoors. The girls also played party games like mafia, and enjoyed talking and giggling.

I Cub Class—2-year-olds (2 days/week)


Lamb Class—3-year-olds (2 days/week)
