

Just too sweet...

November is Diabetes Awareness Month. The American Diabetes Association (ADA) has designated themes for the 4 weeks of November, as they encourage everyone to recognize, decrease risks, and ease the many burdens of diabetes. #TheBigStepUp!

Week 1 (Nov. 1-7): Step Up Awareness. Are you educated about diabetes? Did you know that there are over 30 million people in the US that have diabetes and one in four of them

do not know that they have the disease? More than 1 in 3 adults have prediabetes and over 80% of them do not know it. Many resources are available at Diabetes.org/adm.

Week 2 (Nov. 8-14): Step Up Detection. Prevention begins with knowing the risk factors. (Age 45 or more, are overweight/obese, have a family history of diabetes, certain ethnicities, have high blood pressure, are not physically active, etc.) Take the risk test at Diabetes.org/risktest.

Week 3 (Nov 15-21): Step Up Management. If you have diabetes, how are you doing managing it? Do you need some new ideas? Did you know that you can decrease your risk of getting diabetes by losing as little as 10 or 15#, if you are overweight, get at least 30 minutes of physical activity almost every day of the week, along with eating a healthy diet? (The same things help with managing diabetes, too!) The American Diabetes Association has healthy recipes and newsletters, along with fitness challenges. Check out Diabetes.org/foodhub.

Week 4 (Nov. 22-28): Step Up and Thrive. The ADA is encouraging people to get involved in advocacy, help with the funding, access issues and treatment options. One study indicated that the cost of care for people with diabetes accounted for 1 in 4 health care dollars in 2018. Think about that. See Diabetes.org/advocacy

Coming to Grips with the Real You

Who are you? It's a complicated question, isn't it? On the one hand, your selfconcept is rooted in your family background, your personality, the belief systems you've been taught, and the key people in your life. On the other hand, you may not be who you think you are.

God is the author of your true identity. He knows exactly how He designed you. He knows the **gifts** He's given you to fulfill the purposes He's called you to.That's why Paul urged the Romans to think accurately about themselves:

Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the faith God has distributed to each of you. (Romans 12:3)

When you learn God's view of you—who you really are—everything begins to change, and living a life of true spirituality becomes possible.

As you let God transform your mind, the worldly script that runs through your mind changes. That means your feelings of unworthiness or of pride, the way you relate to others, your thought life, your dreams and goals, they all change too. This especially relates to how you fit into the body of believers, as Paul points out in this passage.

True spirituality is living as a member of Christ's Body, the Church. If you know who you are, you can receive *and give love* the way God designed. You realize where you stand in the body of believers and **use your gifts** effectively. And you can carry out **your** calling to be a transformed, living sacrifice who fits God's purposes completely.
