

New Year's Resolutions!?! Did you set any "resolutions" or goals in January 2021? How did you do with those goals? Most won't remember their goals if they had any. Yet, we consider that we have things that we'd like to "do better." So, many will consider setting goals again in 2022, either formally or informally. How can one have a better chance at success?



Consider selecting only one goal and making sure that it fills you with JOY! Without JOY, most likely the goal will disappear quickly. After identifying what you want, specifically, pray about it and ask the Lord if this is in His Plan, too, and, for His guidance on following through to His Glory. Having goals that are SMART (specific, measurable, achievable, relevant, and time bound) may help set up for success.

What kind of goal will you work on? I know someone who set a goal to play piano every day in December, until Christmas, on a piano that is not in his house. The goal was pretty specific, measurable (did he or not play every day), achievable (sure, he loves to play & share his music with others, lots of places to play & he could play daily), relevant (carols for Christmas) and time centered (December) and it would bring him Joy, as well as joy to others. So, what happened? Pianos were played in hospitals, assisted living, senior housing, nursing facilities, memory units, cafes, etc, socially distanced, masked for everyone's safety. What Joy! The first 10 days of December were so much fun, then the piano player got sick (not covid, but horrible cold) that took him away from public places for several days. Bummer. Goal not met. BUT, symptom free, he played pianos in safe public places until Christmas. No, did not meet the initial goal, but yes, found Joy and will continue to bring Joy! Isn't joy-filled what God wants our lives to be?

Even with setting goals that meet those criteria, things probably will not work out perfectly. Take a breath, adjust expectations, and move on...to find the JOY! What will be your Joy? Maybe it will be a walk with a friend to chat for 30 minutes three days each week for one month or maybe it will be a new healthy recipe twice a month for the next two months. Look for the JOY!

I pray that 2022 brings JOY & PEACE to each of you!

They work through congregations to reach Deaf people and families in their community. There are over 500,000 Deaf people, plus their families, in the United States. The need is great to equip more Deaf leaders through Jesus Signs Training Workshops so they may effectively witness the saving message of Jesus Christ. This grant will assist in expanding training through the sharing of resources, by assisting pastors, and by instructing individuals to lead the workshops. It will also help with workshop expenses to expand training and provide resources throughout the United States.
