WHEN PEOPLE ARE IN GRIEF

Often, we wonder what to say to people who have lost a loved one when we go to the funeral home or when we first talk to them after the death.

Talking with a person grieving the death of a loved one takes us out of our comfort zone. We feel threatened because of our lack of knowing what to say; we may seek to control the conversation and talk about ourselves or another person we know who has gone through a traumatic event. Our compulsion is that we say something, and if we don't know what to say we feel out of control. There is nothing wrong with just being quiet and just listening to a person who is in grief. At other times we know just what to say, for the words of comfort come easily. Helping a person in grief means that we take the opportunity to focus on that person's needs and we look for a way we can help him or her. Never underestimate the importance of just talking about the loved one who died and remembering the good times. That is something we can feel comfortable with in our conversation.

WHAT DO WE NEED TO KEEP IN MIND AS WE TALK TO PEOPLE WHO ARE IN GRIEF? Just talk with them. As you talk, you will notice their lead. They may be sad, in despair, or they may be happy or even lighthearted. Don't question their attitude at that time. They will have times when they laugh and when they cry. Roll with the punches and just be there for them and talk with them. Don't criticize them or preach to them.

Have you ever noticed when one person talks about something bad that has happened, another person may say, "I had an uncle who had something like that happen to him only worse." As if that would make the grieving person feel better. Why do we do that? Because we feel uncomfortable talking about something so sensitive. Bite your tongue at the urge to share your story when grieving people start to talk about their difficult situation. Instead, look for a way to draw them out and encourage them to share. When you listen to them, look at them and encourage them to talk. Give them your undivided attention. Many listeners are so afraid of silence that they don't let the person speaking continue with his or her thoughts. Ask questions so you understand the grieving person and his or her situation better, for this gives the person more opportunity to speak about his or her feelings and needs. Grieving people need to tell their own story, so be quiet and just listen when they talk.




Pumpkins and Pals Highlights

LWML Mission Grants- Bring the Inner-City Children to Camp**2021**–**2023 Mission Grant 16** — \$25,000


Lutheran Valley Retreat (LVR) shares both God's grace and the glory of His creation. Many families in metropolitan Denver are unable to fully finance camp tuition or provide transportation to LVR where their children would experience God's Word in daily devotions, singing, and worshipping around a campfire. This grant will span two summers when LVR will partner with Lutheran churches in Denver to arrange sign-up, transportation, and scholarships for 50 children from the inner city. so they could have this mountain-top camp experience. Research shows that the challenges of camp activities are transformational, giving children tools to overcome real-world challenges when they return home.
