

NEWS FROM ST. PAUL'S GRIEFSHARE MINISTRY

Our sixth cycle of the grief support recovery group has come to a close. We met every week from February 3rd through April 28th. Six women and 2 men faced their pain and fear in the midst of recovery by completing the course. A celebration lunch was held at a restaurant on May 5th, with laughter and fond memories shared. Carolyn McCall and Gretchen Zitterich were leaders this session with substitute assistance from Beth Henriksen and Pat Thiede. Our next cycle will begin again on August 25 for 13 weeks. Watch for a summer reunion of 6 classes in August, date TBD.

2023-2025 LWML MISSION GRANT #30 Showering Love on the Least of These Mercy Holistic Ministry, CA — \$100,000

Washing by the Water and the Word In 2021, Mercy Holistic Ministry (MHM) purchased a portable, two stall shower trailer, bringing showers and the Gospel to parks, parking lots, and community locations of Sacramento where unhoused people live. The trailer is fully self-contained, providing hot water and capturing the wastewater. It houses two spacious shower stalls with a room for dressing. Each shower stall is fully cleaned and sanitized between each guest. Following the shower, people are offered opportunities to speak more in-depth with someone who can pray with them, provide active listening, and make referrals for other services. While their physical needs are addressed, these underserved people will hear that the blood of Jesus washes their sins away and gives eternal life to them. The LWML Mission Grant will increase the frequency of mobile hot shower services Holistic Ministry (MHM) in their mobile shower and haircuts from two to three days per week and serve 2,000 more people annually. A mobile trailer will be purchased and retrofitted to be a closet for clean er. clothing and hygiene kits. God's Word will be shared



After a refreshing hot shower offered by Mercy truck in downtown Sacramento, sometimes the first shower in months! MHM also provides personal hygiene kits and clothing in addition to the show-

by distributing 10 to 15 Bibles and prayer books every week. In the last several years the homeless population in Sacramento has doubled to 10,000 people. These services enhance the feeling of worth, provide hope in Jesus, and give counseling to aid the homeless in applying for jobs or securing an apartment. All people are created in God's image and need to know that they are loved by God in Christ Jesus.



Our next book for July 10 at 7:00 pm is *Indigo Isle* by T. I Lowe. Synopsis by Goodreads: **Sonny**

Bates left South Carolina fifteen years ago and never looked back. Now she's a successful Hollywood location scout who travels the world, finding perfect places for movie shoots. Home is wherever she lands, and between her busy schedule and dealing with her boss's demands, she has little time to think about the past . . . until her latest gig lands her a stone's throw from everything she left behind.

Searching off the coast of Charleston for a secluded site to film a key scene, Sonny wanders onto a private barrier island and encounters its reclusive owner, known by locals as the Monster of Indigo Isle. What she finds is a man much more complex than the myth.

Once a successful New York attorney, Hudson Renfrow's grief has exiled him to his island for several years. He spends his days alone, tending his fields of indigo, then making indigo dye--and he has no interest in serving the intrusive needs of a film company or yielding to Sonny's determined curiosity. But when a hurricane makes landfall on the Carolina coast, stranding them together, an unlikely friendship forms between the two damaged souls. Soon the gruff exterior Hudson has long hidden behind crumbles--exposing the tender part of him that's desperate for forgiveness and a second chance.
