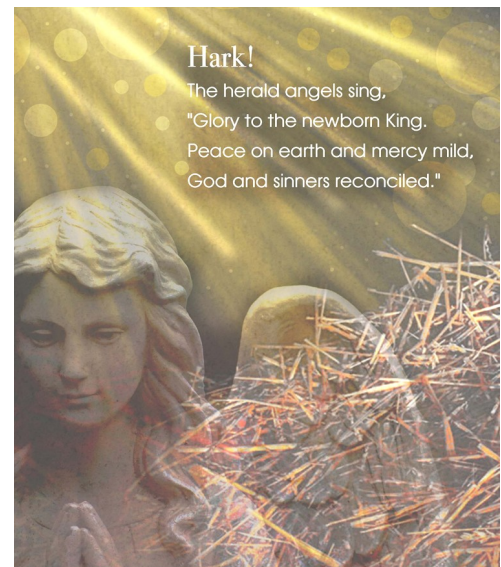
Christmas: It's All About Jesus!

Christmas time is here—a time to celebrate the birth of our Risen Savior! It is a time of joy, togetherness and, if we are honest, a time of smorgasbord of irresistible treats. The tables groan under the weight of so much food—multiplying like the loaves and fishes! How do we balance the call to honor our bodies as a temple of the Lord with the overflowing of the tables?

Consider:

Gratitude! Slow down and give thanks! Then stay slowed down as you eat, to really taste and enjoy! God gave you those wonderful flavors and textures—don't wolf them down. Taking small bites often gives as much flavor and pleasure as stuffing your mouth full!

Portion control parable: think about your serving sizes like the widow's oil—small but miraculously satisfying.

The rainbow: How many colors are on your plate? If you are the host, are you providing many colorful options—not just fruit flavored jellybeans, but fruit & vegetables? If you are a guest, can you bring colors to complement the meal?

Self-control is a fruit of the spirit, as is Joy! Maybe use both? Joyful conversation has no calories and endless rewards.

Lifegiving water! Water refreshes and revitalizes us. Dehydration and fatigue go together and, often, people eat when they want a recharge. Drink up!

Joyful movement. Jesus walked. Praise God that we can walk and enjoy His creation and have fellowship with others as we walk. Walking and other activities helps us handle stress of the holidays, manage hunger, and many other healthful blessings.

Rest. Jesus took time away from the hustle and bustle of life to connect with his Father, resting. Sleep those 7-9 hours and rest in His arms.

Forgive. Others. Yourself. God's grace is bigger than your plate.

This CHRISTmas Season, embrace the joy and laughter that comes with gathering together. Eat mindfully, love generously, laugh often. Savor the moments and the food (especially the pie!). Healthy holiday eating is about balance, thankfulness—not deprivation. As Proverbs 17:22 reminds us, “A cheerful heart is good medicine.” So, bring on the cheer, and maybe just one slice of pie! The Perpetual Call for Pastors and Teachers

LWML 2025–2027 Mission Grant 4 — \$100,000

Set Apart to Serve is a Synod-wide program focused on forming and recruiting full-time pastors and church workers. Supplying the church with church workers is one of the highest priorities of the LCMS, since pastors and commissioned church workers preach and teach the Word of Christ through which the Holy Spirit creates and sustains faith. The demand for more pastors, Lutheran school teachers, and commissioned church workers is urgent.

Set Apart to Serve is providing resources to encourage intentional conversations with youth to pursue a church work vocation. This is leading to increased enrollment in the church worker formation programs at the LCMS Concordia universities and the seminaries. Districts and churches are being encouraged to reach out to their youth through workshops and conferences.



The heart of *Set Apart To Serve* (SAS) is the formation of church workers to ensure that LCMS continues to proclaim and teach the Gospel of Jesus Christ in our congregations and communities until Christ returns. Pastors and professional church workers are indispensable to accomplishing each of the Synod's seven mission priorities.

This grant will help to cover a part of the expenses of creating resources, travel and presentations at workshops and conferences, and staffing.

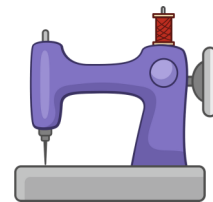
LWML Mite Update:

Our next book for Jan. 15 at 2:15 pm is “The Edge of Belonging” by Amanda Cox. Synopsis: When Ivy Rose returns to her hometown to oversee an estate sale, she soon discovers that her grandmother left behind more than trinkets and photo frames--she provided a path to the truth behind Ivy's adoption. Shocked, Ivy seeks clues to her past, but a key piece to the mystery is missing.

Twenty-four years earlier, Harvey James finds an abandoned newborn who gives him a sense of human connection for the first time in his life. His desire to care for the baby runs up against the stark fact that he is homeless. When he becomes entwined with two people seeking to help him find his way, Harvey knows he must keep the baby a secret or risk losing the only person he's ever loved.

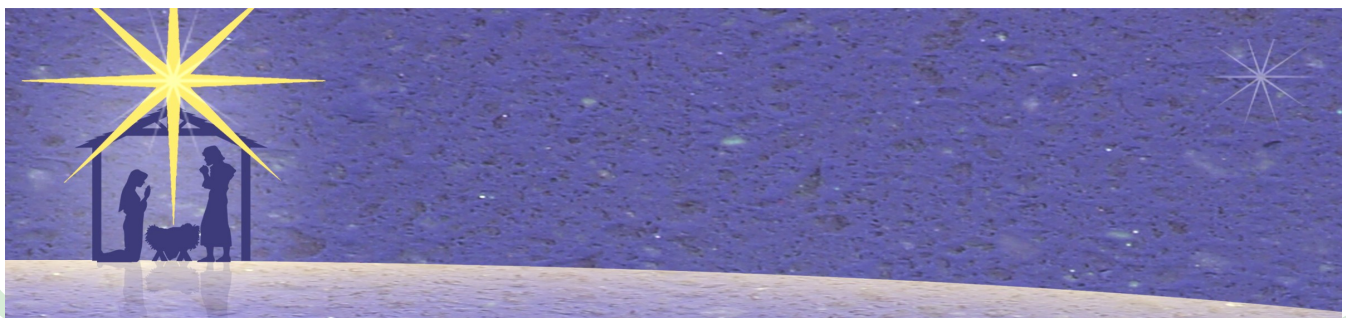
